

## 3 LICENSING

### 3.1 LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

#### 3.1.1 Licensing Conditions

3.1.1.1 A person may only participate in a competition event if they are the holder of a competition licence as detailed in the following table 3.1.2.

3.1.1.2 A person may only participate in a non-

competition activity or event if they are the holder of a competition or non-competition licence detailed in the following table 3.1.2.

NOTE 1: In table 3.1.2: ✓ means eligible, X means ineligible. The rules below explain the other symbols in the table.

NOTE 2: Normal competition rules apply for all practices on all MA licensed tracks.

3.1.2.1 † Junior Competition (National Competition and Restricted National) licenses can only be held by riders aged 7 to under 16 years.

3.1.2.2 Senior National Competition (National Competition and Restricted National) licenses can only be held by riders aged 16 and over.

3.1.2.3 \*Restricted National Licence will be subject to the following conditions.

a) The licence will be available for both Junior and Senior competitors.

b) The licence will apply to the following categories:

i) Fast 50's

ii) Minimoto

iii) Trial

c) ~~Licensing requirements are as GCR 3.2, 3.3 and 3.4.~~

3.1.2.4 ♣ Club, Inter-Club and National events can hold non-competitive activities

specifically for Mini Licence holders using 50cc Demo machines (4 to Under 9 years). This licence can also be used for Minikhana activities (4 to Under 16 years), and non-competitive events.

### 3.2 LICENSING - GENERAL

3.2.1.1 Any rider, who is transported to hospital, recommended to attend hospital or is advised by a medical practitioner that they require a medical clearance before taking part in any further competition event will have their licence suspended until such time as they supply a medical clearance to MA, their SCB or a Key Official at an MA permitted event.

### 3.3 LICENSING – SENIORS

3.3.1.1 An application for a competition licence, other than a one event licence or International licence, must:

- a) Be to the SCB of the State or Territory in which the applicant ordinarily resides;
- b) Be in the prescribed form.
- c) Be accompanied by:
  - i) Proof that the applicant is 16 years of age or over;
  - ii) Proof that the applicant has passed an appropriate licence test;
  - iii) Proof the applicant has current ambulance subscription;
  - iv) The prescribed fee; and
  - v) Proof of current MA affiliated club membership.
- d) If the applicant is a minor, be accompanied by the written authorisation of at least one of the applicant's parents or the legal guardian of the applicant.
- e) If the applicant has never been the holder of a competition licence, be accompanied by any one of the following:
  - i) The applicant's current road motorcycle licence;
  - ii) Proof that the applicant has attended a motorcycle training course conducted by, or with the approval of, a State Government authority;
  - iii) Proof that the applicant has attended any SCB accredited training school;
  - iv) Proof that the applicant has attended a training school conducted by an accredited coach; or
  - v) Endorsement on the application by a club official authorised by the SCB that, in the opinion of that official, the applicant is capable of controlling a motorcycle.

3.3.1.2 A first time licence applicant must undertake

a test of knowledge of these Rules

3.3.1.3 Senior licence holders may only compete in senior competition classes or participate in senior recreational events.

### 3.4 LICENSING – JUNIORS

3.4.1.1 An application for a Junior competition licence, other than a one event licence must:

- a) Be to the SCB of the State or Territory in which the applicant ordinarily resides;
- b) Be in the prescribed form;
- c) Be accompanied by:
  - i) Proof of the age of the applicant;
  - ii) Proof the applicant has current ambulance subscription; and
  - iii) The prescribed fee.
- iv) Proof that the applicant has met the requirements of the Junior Coaching Program (JCP) – GGR 3.1.1.3.
- v) Written authorisation of at least one of the applicant's parents or the legal guardian of the applicant.
- iv) Proof of current club membership.

3.4.1.2 No applicant will be issued with their first competition licence if they are under the age of 7 years.

3.4.1.3 All Junior competitors:

- a) Must produce their JCP logbook upon demand to any key official during any event
- b) If unable to produce their JCP logbook, complete a declaration certifying their compliance with the logbook requirement of these Rules accompanied by the prescribed fee.

3.4.1.4 Junior licence holders may only compete in junior competitions or participate in junior recreational events, unless they attain a discipline specific senior endorsement. Refer to the MA Licence Conditions Document available at [www.ma.org.au](http://www.ma.org.au).

### 3.5 LICENCE ISSUING & RENEWALS

3.5.1.1 An application for renewal of a Senior competition licence must:

- a) Be to the SCB of the State or Territory in which the applicant ordinarily resides;
- b) Be in the prescribed form.
- c) Be accompanied by:
  - i) Proof the applicant has a current ambulance subscription; and
  - ii) The prescribed fee

- iii)- Proof of current club membership;
- iv)- Proof that the rider is 16 years of age or over.

3.5.1.2 — An application for renewal of a Junior competition licence must:

- a) — Be to the SCB of the State or Territory in which the applicant ordinarily resides;
- b) — Be in the prescribed form;
- c) — Be accompanied by:
  - i) — Proof the applicant has a current ambulance subscription, and
  - ii) — The prescribed fee;
  - iii)- Proof of current club membership;
  - iv)- Proof that the rider is under the age of 16, as of the 1st of January for the application year.

3.5.1.3 — On receipt of an application for the issue or renewal of a competition licence the SCB may:

- a) — Delay the issue or renewal for no more than 14 days;
- b) — Issue or renew the licence unconditionally;
- c) — Refuse to issue or renew the licence, or
- d) — Issue or renew the licence on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.

### 3.6 — ONE EVENT COMPETITION

3.6.1.1 — One Event Competition Licence is subject to the following conditions:

- a) — Licence will be available to all applicants 7 years and older
- b) — Current club membership is required
- c) — No competency test is required if the applicant can prove they have held an annual competition licence within the previous 10 years
- d) — Applicants who have never held a competition licence, or who have not held a licence in the previous 10 years maybe required to undertake a competency test. The competency assessment maybe undertaken at the permitted activity in which the participant intends to compete.
- e) — This licence category will only be available at the discretion of the RCB and must be printed in the relevant Supplementary Regulations:

### 3.7 — ONE EVENT RECREATIONAL

3.7.1.1 — One Event Recreational Licence is subject to the following conditions:

- a) — Licence will be available to all

applicants 4 years and older

- b) — No competency test is required if the applicant can prove they have held an annual recreational or competition licence within the previous 10 years
- c) — Applicants who have never held a recreational or competition licence, or who have not held a licence in the previous 10 years maybe required to undertake a competency test. The competency assessment maybe undertaken at the permitted activity in which the participant intends to take part

### 3.8 — LICENSING — INTRODUCTORY RECREATIONAL

3.8.1.1 — The Introductory Recreational Licence is a 90 day recreational licence that is utilised for the introduction to the sport. To obtain a Introductory Recreational Licence:

- a) — The applicant must have completed a come and try event.
- b) — The applicant must then submit proof of participation to their respective SCB at which point the Introductory Recreational Licence will be provided.
- c) — The Introductory Recreational Licence can only be obtained once by an applicant.
- d) — Licence will be available to all applicants 4 years and older.

### 3.9 — LICENSING — ENTRANTS

3.9.1.1 — A person or body corporate may not enter any rider to participate in any competition unless that person or body corporate is licensed as an Entrant.

3.9.1.2 — MA, or an SCB on behalf of MA, may issue an Entrant's licence to any person or body corporate. The form of an Entrant's licence will be as per the Licence Conditions document available at [www.ma.org.au](http://www.ma.org.au).

### 3.10 — LICENSING — CREW

3.10.1.1 — A person may not work as Crew for any rider in any Speedway competition unless that person:

- a) — Is licensed as Crew,
- b) — Is not less than 16 years of age,
- c) — Or holds a current Senior National Competition licence

3.10.1.2 — The crew licence may be required by promoters of other disciplines events to access restricted areas.
